




The Easiest Way To Boost Your Warehouse Efficiency

As a business owner, you know that nothing affects your bottom line as profoundly as increased efficiency.

You're also aware that you can't just flip a switch and suddenly become super-efficient.

For example, things like training employees and developing processes take a ton of time and energy - and while it's worth it to boost your efficiency, the change doesn't happen overnight.

But what if we told you could boost your efficiency and start seeing better profits right now?

Let's dig into the details of how it works!

1 • Save space with double-deep racking

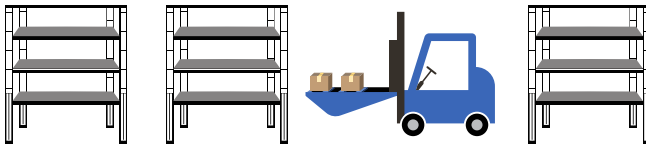
Most warehouses have shelving that is two racks deep.

With a normal forklift and standard length forks, this is required. You first put a pallet of your product on the right shelf, go get another pallet, and place this pallet on the left shelf.



But what if you could carry two pallets at one time with your forklift? Suddenly you would be able to have "double-deep racking" or an aisle of two shelves.

You pick up two pallets of product and place them on the two shelves on the right - in one trip! Then, get two more pallets and place them on the two shelves on the left - again in one trip.



This increases warehouse capacity up to 30% compared to the standard, single-deep warehouse set up.

2. Unload and load multiple pallets per pick for 50% time savings

You've just come home from the grocery store. Stashed in the back seat of your vehicle is 8 bags of groceries.

You could grab two bags - one in each hand and head to the house. Using this method, you would have to take 4 trips backs and forth from house to vehicle.

Or you could grab 4 bags - two in each and get all your groceries carried in with just one trip.

You just cut your grocery-carrying time - **in half!**



Sure, the concept is simple. And for carrying a few bags of groceries it might not seem that significant. But make it 1,000 bags of groceries and suddenly cutting your time in half seems extremely important, right?

And carrying 1,000 bags of groceries for 5 days a week, 300 days out of the year? At this point, you'd do anything to cut your hauling time down!

By allowing you to carry twice the material, forklift extensions give you the ability to cut your product transport time in half. Let's repeat that - in half!

Over an extended period of time the amount of money and time this saves your is phenomenal.

3. Load and unload trailers from just one side

If you load and unload trailers, forklift extensions are a must have.

The first thing fork extensions offer when loading or unloading a trailer is increased safety.

Rather than having several men on each side of the trailer who have a hard time communicating, everyone can stay on one side where they can easily see and hear each other.

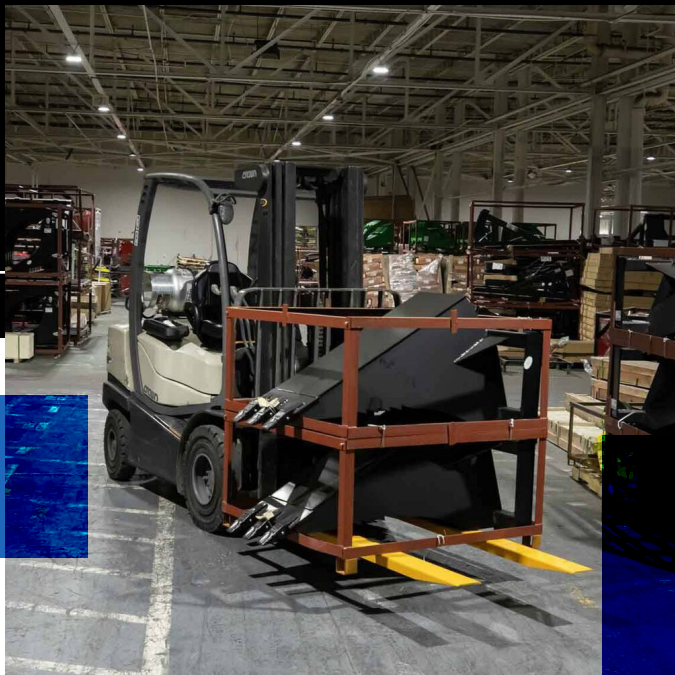
Plus, the forklift operator is less likely to bump product off the other side of the trailer that has already been loaded when the forklift stays on one side.

Fork extensions also make the process of loading and unloading trailers more efficient.

Rather than driving from one side of the trailer to the other, you can quickly load the trailer from one side.



4. Make your forklift work for multiple jobs



Perhaps you're asking:

“If long forks are such a great thing, why take the extra step of getting fork extensions when you could just get a forklift with longer tines and skip the hassle?”

That’s a good question - and to be clear for extremely heavy lifting long tines are better than forklift extensions.

But remember:

Sometimes short tines are better than long ones. For example, if you are maneuvering in tight spaces you don't want long forks damaging your building and products.

Forklift extensions allow you to easily switch between short and long forks.

Need to get around in a tight space?

Take the extension off.

Want to load multiple pallets at one time?

Put the extensions on.

This allows you to have fewer forklifts that are more versatile, rather than many specialized forklifts, and as a result cuts down on your overhead.
